Instructions for poster presentations

All poster presenters should submit their final paper in the normal manner.

Each poster will be allocated a certain session either on Wednesday 13 September or Thursday 14 September for the presentation. Presentation times will be specified on the PIMRC'06 website on 30 June 2006.

The duration of one poster session is **1 hour 40 minutes**. There will be approximately 20 posters presented in each poster session. Please make sure that you arrive to the poster session area next to the registration and information desk at Finlandia Hall at the latest **20 minutes before** the beginning of your allocated poster session. Each poster wall has a serial number which is the number indicated in the Final Programme. Please use the space reserved for your poster. All posters must be removed at the latest **15 minutes after** the end of the poster session in question.

Poster sessions are a valuable method for authors to present papers and meet with interested attendees for in-depth technical discussions. A physical arrangement similar to an exhibit area is used for this interaction. Each presenter is provided with two poster walls each with a space of **160cm x 95cm** available for displaying posters (see picture). The widest distance between the actual walls in the area reserved for one poster presenter is 136cm.

Poster walls are covered with felt fabric. Posters can be attached by needle pins and if the posters are framed they can be attached by hooks. There will be a representative from the conference organisation helping with the poster session arrangements on site.

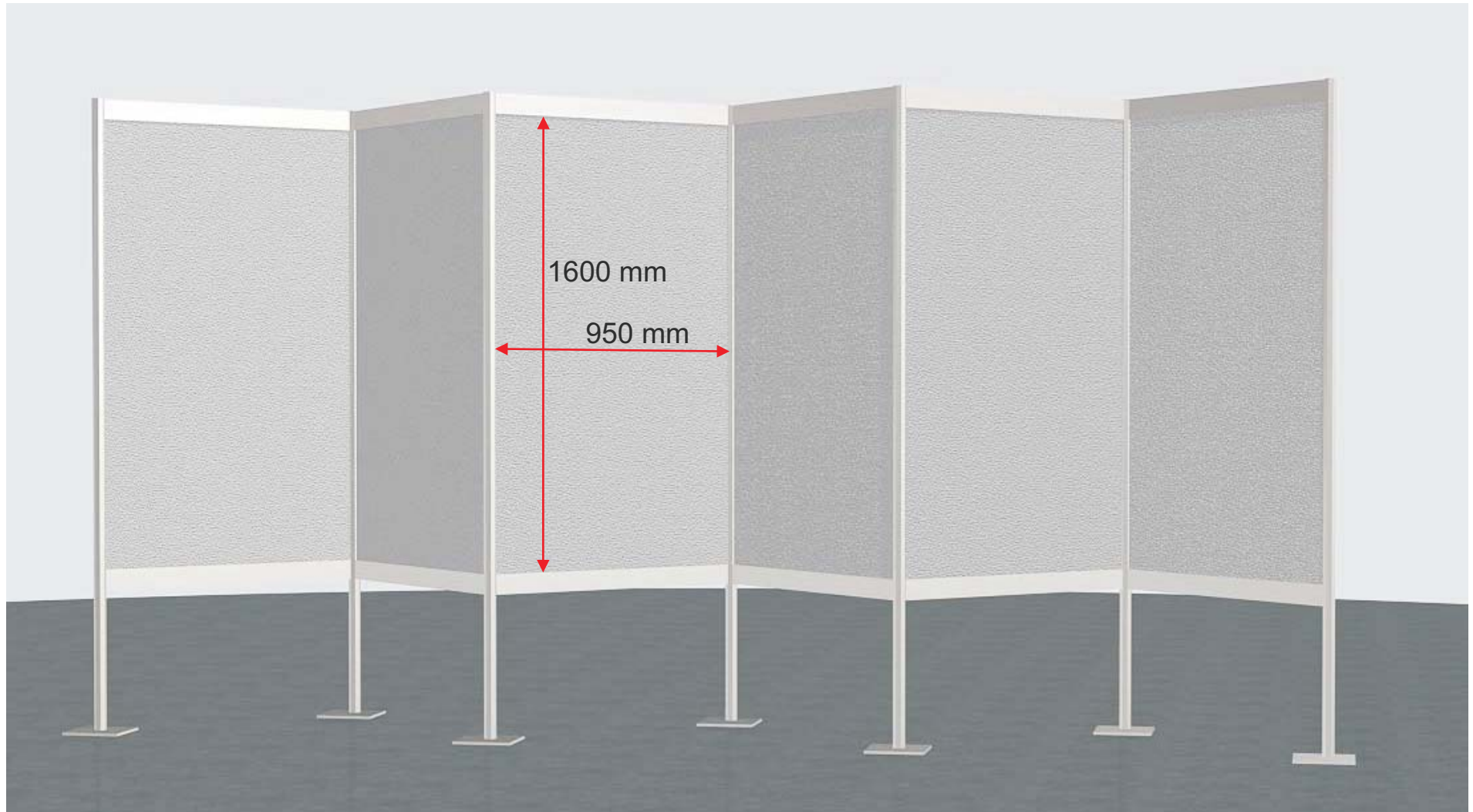
No audio-visual equipment will be provided for poster presentations. However, requests can also be made for a table for showing some equipment or similar. Please send an e-mail to pimrc2006@ee.oulu.fi if you will need one.

Poster presentation recommendations

It is important that you display your results clearly to attract people who have an interest in your work and your paper.

- Your poster should cover the **KEY POINTS** of your work. The ideal poster is designed to (1) attract attention; (2) provide a brief overview of your work; and (3) initiate discussion and questions.
- The title of your poster should appear at the top in **CAPITAL** letters about 25mm high.
- The author(s) name(s) and affiliation(s) are put below the title.
- Carefully prepare your poster well in advance of the conference. There will be no time or materials available for last minute preparations at the conference. If you think you may need certain materials to repair the poster after travelling, bring them with you.
- Use colour to highlight and make your poster more attractive, and use pictures, diagrams, cartoons, figures, etc., rather than only text wherever possible.
- The smallest text on your poster should be at least 9mm high, and the important points should be in a larger size.
- Make your poster as self-explanatory as possible, which will save you time to use for discussions and questions.
- Prepare a short presentation of about 5 or 10 minutes that you can periodically give to those assembled around your poster throughout the 1 hour 40 min poster session. If possible, more than one author should attend the session to aid in presentations and discussions, and to provide the presenters with the chance to rest or briefly view other posters.
